

## Connect to Brigham Net using Windows XP Home 98 and ME Edition

1. Click the **Start** button in the lower left corner and Select **Run** from the pop up menu.
2. Delete anything in the Run dialog box and then type **inetwiz** and click **OK**
3. Verify that you have a dot next to “**Connect using my phone line**”
4. Click the **Next** button.
5. Make sure the **Area code is blank** and enter the phone Number  
**538-5988 for Brigham City, Bear River, Corinne, Honeyville, Willard, Mantua, Perry, & Deweyville.** (*Please verify it is not long distance from your location*)
6. **Click the Next Button.**
7. Type your brigham net **username** i.e. ([username@brigham.net](mailto:username@brigham.net)) and **password** into the boxes then click **Next**.  
*Note: Password is Case Sensitive and will appear as asterisks as you type it.*
8. Type **brigham.net** as the name for your connection then click **Next**.
9. If you want to setup your email then select **Yes** when asked to setup your email account then click **Next**. **If your not doing email then you are done.**
10. Select **Setup a new Account**
11. In the **Display Name** box, type the name you want others to see when you send a email message, and then click **Next**.
12. In the E-mail Address box, type the e-mail address for the account you are using, it is your **login name followed by @brigham.net** Example username@brigham.net, and then click **Next**.
13. Our mail server is a **POP3** server which is the default so don't change this. Type **mail.brigham.net** in both the **Incoming Mail Server** and **Outgoing Mail Server** boxes. Click the **Next** Button
14. Type your **username** in the **Account name box**. (Do not include @brigham.net). Type your **password** in the **Password box**. Verify there is a checkmark in the save password box. If it is not there click on it to change it.
15. In the Internet Mail Account Name box, type a name to identify the mail account you are configuring. This is known as the "friendly" name for the account. Click **Next**.  
*Outlook Express 5 will not ask for this information.*

- 16.** Click the connection type that you use to connect to the Internet, and then click Next.  
*NOTE: This step does not apply to Outlook Express 5. Click "Use my phone line to connect,"* you are prompted to either create a new Dial-Up Networking connection or use an existing one. If Dial-Up Networking has been configured for your ISP, click "Use an existing dial-up connection," click the name for your Dial-Up Networking connection in the list, and then click Next.
- 17.** Click Finish.
